



## The International Society for Serotonin Research Call for Young Investigator Travel Awards

2025 Meeting of the ISSR, Vienna, Austria, July 7-11  
“A Serotonin Symphony in Vienna”

Applications from graduate students and postdoctoral fellows are invited for travel awards to attend the 2025 meeting of the ISSR. These awards will cover meeting registration and provide financial support to help defray some of the travel costs for young investigators to attend and participate in the 2025 meeting. The size of award will be contingent upon need (i.e. distance to travel), the amounts will be up to \$2000 USD (Americas, Asia, Africa, Oceania), \$800 (Europe), and \$600 (Austria, not Vienna). Applicants will be notified as soon as possible after the submission deadline of January 5, 2025, but no later than February 1, 2025.

For those applicants who will register to attend the meeting before award notification, please use the “travel award applicant” registration rate and this will be refunded to successful awardees and the balance will be due for other attendees. This will allow you to secure hotel arrangements as early as possible.

Awardees will present their work as a poster and/or oral presentation and will be matched with a member of the ISSR who will serve as mentor and help with networking throughout the meeting. Eligibility: Current graduate students or postdoctoral fellows within three years of their graduation at the time of application may apply. Individuals already taking part in a programmed symposium are not eligible. Membership in the ISSR is not a requirement to apply, however, membership is strongly encouraged/desirable (instructions for how to join the ISSR may be found at (<https://www.serotoninclub.org/join>)).

The Application Packet includes 1) Abstract (one page, Arial font, size 11, inclusive of Title, Authors, Affiliations, abstract body and funding sources), 2) curriculum vitae, and 3) letter of support from the applicant’s Mentor which also confirms graduate student or postdoctoral fellow status.

Selection of Travel Awardees will be based on:

- The quality of submitted abstract: The abstract must be of high scientific rigor and present novel, previously unpublished data.
- Curriculum vitae: The applicant’s curriculum vitae must demonstrate a track record of scientific excellence and productivity, commensurate with the career stage of the applicant.
- Letter of support from the Mentor: This letter must document that the applicant is in good academic standing and comment on the applicant’s potential for a career as an independent scientist.
